Hello, my name is _____. I am a staff member from the New York Langone Health conducting a research interview about starting a *Patient-Centered Stomach Cancer Prevention in Chinese Americans* program with your clinic site. Your participation is completely voluntary. This means that you do not have to participate in this interview unless you want to. Would you be willing to answer some questions about your use of the EHR and health coaching, how the program was started, and recommendations to replicate this program for other clinical sites and communities?

The research interview will take approximately 30 minutes. (If yes, continue. If no, thank them for their time.)

Thank you for agreeing to participate. Please do your best to answer all the questions, as your responses will help us to understand what works and doesn't work about the program and can help us to improve it and bring it to other sites. However, if you find some of the questions difficult or sensitive in nature and do not wish to answer a question, just tell me and we will skip it, and go on to the next one. I appreciate your time.

The purpose of this research study survey is to learn how the project was started at your organization, how it worked, and how it can be started in other clinical/community settings.

We estimate that approximately 8 people will enroll in this study.

With your permission, I'd like to audio-record the interview so that I can take notes from the recording later on. I will not record or report your name. I will use a special code instead of your name to label the audio recording file and connect it to the interview notes. The audio recordings will be stored on a password-protected secure computer at the NYUSOM. Once audio recordings are transcribed and entered onto a password protected database, the recordings will be deleted from the study files. The data collected for this study will only be available to the NYU research staff. The recording will help me to make sure not to miss any important information that can help improve the program. Audio recording is required for participation. If you do not wish to be recorded, you cannot participate in this study.

Would it be okay if I audio-recorded our interview? (If yes, continue. If no, thank them for their time.)

You also need to understand that all information that I receive from you will be strictly confidential. Again, we will not be attaching your name to the transcript or recording of this interview. I will not identify you or use any information that would make it possible for anyone to identify you in any presentation or written reports about this study. If it is okay with you, I might want to use direct quotes from you, but these would only be cited as from a person from your community.

There is no expected risk to you for helping me with this study. Your decision to participate or not participate will not affect your employment, reputation or professional relationships. Your record of participation cannot be linked to your employment record. There are no expected alternatives or benefits to you either. When I get back all the surveys of everyone who has agreed to participate, I will group all the answers together in any type of report or presentation. There will be no way to identify individual participants.

Do you still want to talk with me? Remember, your participation is voluntary; you do not have to answer these questions.

There are no costs to you to participate in this study.

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If you do not agree to verbally consent to participating in this study, your relationship with your organization and participation in this program will not be affected.
